- 3. Notify the Practicum Office (practicum.fsw@utoronto.ca) that you have applied.
- 4. Only students selected for an interview will be contacted.
- 5. You may still participate in the PAS matching process.

If you are selected for an interview:

 The successful candidate(s) will be required to submit a police check with the vulnerable sector completed BEFORE they can commence practicum in September.

At the end, students will have an opportunity to sign up for an interview at a later time in March.
