In 2012, Will transitioned into his current role at College View and Simon Supportive Housing Services program which serves over 90 residents through supportive housing and case management services. Will was also part of a successful funding proposal to the Toronto Central LHIN for Assisted Living Services which allows LOFT to reach an additional 40 clients in the Yonge and College neighbourhood.
