Interprofessional Education

"Interprofessional education occurs when two or more professions learn **about**, **from** and **with** each other to enable effective collaboration and improve health outcomes."



IPE Core Competencies

The Interprofessional Education Curriculum is broken down into competencies, each represented on a learning continuum under 3 components: (1) Exposure (Introduction); (2) Immersion (Development); (3) Competence (Entry-to-Practice).



IPE Withdrawal & DNA

- A DNA (did not attend) will appear on your student record should you miss an activity you have registered for.



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
