Students obtain course credit, community attendees receive a certificate of completion	\$5K -\$7K Would support seed funds for a faculty member to develop a course, and a small stipend for community participants
MOOC (Massive Open Online Courses)*	\$5K-\$7K
Global Classroom Develop live stream course(s) for a global audience	\$3K-\$5K

Student Leadership Scholars Program-\$20K

- Program would match 10 students through a competitive process with 10 mentors from government, business, social services, the arts, etc.
- Mentors and mentees would have 4-5 touch points during the year
- Mentees would take a combination of courses and/or attend brown bag sessions that would result in a leadership certificate
- Mentees would be provided with a stipend*
- Select mentors would provide public talks to all students, which would be co-hosted with allied faculties depending on their specialty focus
