- Create opportunities for students to connect with professors such as lunch and learns, meet the professors' night, and speed faculty-student networking events.
- Facilitate in-person and virtual spaces for BIPOC and LGBTQ2S+ students to connect, learn from one another, and discuss strategies that they are using to prepare themselves for graduation.
- Collaborate with stakeholders to facilitate workshops on topics such as managing stress, overcoming



imposter syndrome, effective job search techniques, job application writing skills, preparing for the workplace, making time for self-care, and working within multidisciplinary teams.

- Increase mental health and health services for graduating students to support them in attaining the skills to manage challenges throughout the program and achieve holistic well-being.
- Acquire more scholarship and bursary opportunities for students.
- Facilitate appreciation events for students and faculty who have made significant contributions within the field.
- Create engaging Alumni reunion gatherings and events.

I hold an Honours Bachelor of Fine Arts, a diploma Professional Photography, and certificates in Applied Media Communication and Digital Marketing.
