Practicum site: Women's College Hospital, Women's Mental Health Department, Trauma Therapy Program, Women Recovering from Abuse Program (WRAP).

Program description: WRAP is an ongoing 8-week day treatment program offering group and individual therapy to women (cis and trans), non-binary and gender diverse folks who have experienced childhood trauma (physical, emotional and sexual abuse and neglect) and who suffer from mental health issues. This relational therapy program helps people develop new ways of engaging with others; managing difficult situations, understanding their feelings, thoughts and behaviours, developing and strengthening helping coping strategies. WRAP's clinical approach combines expressive, creative, interpersonal, cognitive behavioural, psycho-educational and body-oriented therapies to help promote and integrate recovery.

Student activities:

- Observe and move into a co-facilitation role in group therapy sessions
- Provide weekly individual therapy to 1-2 WRAP clients
- Participate in psychosocial intake assessments
- Documentation using electronic health record system
- Attend and participate in team supervision meetings and departmental/social work meetings
- Possibility to engage in program planning and research projects
- Complete suggested readings and familiarize self with community resources for discharge planning
- Attend mental health grand rounds and other learning opportunities within the hospital

Practicum Requirement:

- Immunizations per PHA Guidelines
- N95 Respirator/Mask Fitting
- Covid Vaccinations
- Influenza Vaccination (Flu shot)
- Police Reference/Vulnerable Sector Check
- Comfort working with the population being served
- Comprehensive report writing and documentation
