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Acknowledgement of Traditional Land

Practicum 1

- Commences January 10, 2024
 - Deferrals to summer 2024 are possible. An application is required and can be found on the Practicum website, under Students > Forms
 - Spring/summer 2024 practicum protocol will be communicated in January 2024.



Time Requirement

469 hours (67 days, 7 hours per day):

- January 10 May 31, 2024
 - January 10 April 5: 3 days/week: Wednesday,
 Thursday and Friday
 - Cannot impact Monday and Tuesday classes
 - April 9 May 31: 4 days/week: Tuesday,
 Wednesday, Thursday, Friday

Practicum Matching Options

The Practicum Administration System (PAS) is the primary mode of assigning students (description follows)

Five alternate practicum matching options are also available:



Matching Alternatives

- Place of Employment: application on Practicum website (For students > Forms)
- 2. Off-PAS: competitive or located outside GTA
- 3. In your home community: Contact Practicum Office
- 4. Summer 2024 Application on Practicum website (For students > Forms)
- 5. Personal circumstances for which the Practicum Office may be a support



Matching Alternatives

- You will not participate in the PAS process if:
 - you are accepted for a deferral, competitive, or outsidethe-GTA practicum
 - you secure a practicum in your place of work, or your home community (consult with the Practicum Office first)
- If your alternate practicum does not work out, the Practicum Office will work with you.



Practicum Administration System (PAS)

- A practicum-specific database (separate from ACORN)
- Used by the Practicum Office to:
 - Post descriptions of available practicums (field instructor manages descriptions)
 - Match students with practicums
 - Maintain student, field instructor and practicum records
- Used by students to:
 - View available practicum descriptions
 - Submit practicum choices
 - Submit midterm and final practicum self-evaluations





PAS

- Used by Field Instructors to:
 - o Post and edit practicum descriptions
 - Submit midterm and final practicum evaluations
 - This is a dynamic tool. Field instructors are responsible for providing accurate information for students to view
- Used by Faculty-Field Liaisons and Education Coordinators to:
 - Review midterm and final evaluations



PAS Matching Process Overview

- The PAS displays all practicums available that are not alternate practicum options.
- Read all practicum descriptions paying careful attention to requirements
- Select 10 practicums on Form A
- Submit Form A on the PAS. Submission schedule will be emailed to you and posted on website
- Practicum Office runs the computer program
- Results: 1 interview/practicum match which is your confirmed practicum; displayed on your PAS profile




Form A

- Select 10 practicums on Form A by category:
 - Three from Category A (specialized)
 - Three from Category B (community-based)
 - Three from Category C (health care/hospitals)
 - One from any category
- The PAS will not accept less than 10 choices
- There is no benefit to submitting early. All Form As are considered on the final date/time, after which no submission will be permitted
- You can resubmit Form A as many times as you wish before the deadline
- The Practicum Office will email and post the matching schedule on the FIFSW website




Form A example






Add practicum choices to Form A

How the PAS works

- a red title indicates a practicum that 10 or more students have chosen (in demand)
- Practicums may be added and withdrawn by organizations throughout the matching process. "Updated", "New" practicums will be displayed in red
- Form A can be submitted as many times as you wish before the final submission date.
- If a student is matched with a public hospital in the GTA for Practicum 1 SWK4701, they cannot select a public hospital in the GTA for Practicum 2 SWK4702.





The matching process

- The PAS computer algorithm matches as many students as possible with one of their Form A choices
- Some students will not be matched in the first round. This is not uncommon.
- If you are not matched with a practicum in the first round, the Practicum Office will contact you with next steps.
- One practicum match will be displayed on your PAS profile page
- Field instructor sees their match as well
- Email your field instructor(s) to request an interview

PHA (Public Hospitals Act) of Ontario Requirements

- Students whose practicum is in a healthcare facility under the Public Hospitals Act PHA must submit a complete UofT Immunization Record Form to FIFSW contracted RN Kathy Delic for approval
- Failure to be in compliance may delay or cancel a practicum
- Healthcare providers are busy! Please begin this process as soon as possible





Possible fees

- TB test or healthcare provider completing FIFSW immunization form
- N95 Mask Fitting approximately \$40.00
- Vulnerable Sector Screening (in Toronto) \$27.00
- Vulnerable sector screening in other jurisdictions: Practicum Office will write a letter if required by police services
- Parking, Public transit costs



The Interview

Pre-Interview

- Contact the field instructor
 - Confirm the location or online invitation
 - Ask about the style and structure of the interview
 - Ask if they require a resume, cover letter, etc in advance or at the interview
- Research the organization
- Review the description and requirements on the PAS

Interview

- Be punctual and professional
- Be prepared to talk about your undergrad/work/volunteer experience
- Be prepared to respond to case scenarios or write sample case notes
- Discuss how this practicum will develop social work competencies
- Ask questions

Post-Interview

- If you have concerns about this practicum match, contact the Practicum Office immediately
- If there are no concerns, this is your final practicum match



Accessibility Accommodations

- If accommodations are required, you must register with UofT Accessibility Office (Student Life).
- The Practicum Office will support any accommodations requests
- Notify the Practicum Office as early as possible if you are registering with Accessibility Services
