



Hamilton General Hospital Centralized Care and Transition Team (CCaTT) Year 2 Practicum September 2024-April 2025

Practicum Description:

"Hamilton General Hospital, along with providing general internal medicine care to its large community, it is home to a number of Hamilton Health Sciences' key regional referral programs, including: burns, cardiac catheterization, cardiac surgery, electrophysiology, endovascular treatment, extracorporeal life support (ECMO), neurosurgery, stroke, trauma and vascular surgery. It is also home to programs that provide specialized care to our HNHBB residents: cardiology, neurology and spine. In addition to providing leadingedge care, HGH is strongly connected to its neighbourhood and supports outreach activities aimed at helping to enhance the quality of life in the surrounding community."

This practicum will be working in the Emergency Department and Express Unit on what is known as the Centralized Care and Transition Team (CCaTT). CCaTT completes comprehensive geriatric assessments of multiple domains potentially contributing to frailty and develops / recommends interventions aligned with best practice. These patients are usually greater than or equal to 65 years of age and from independent living.

Students will participate in interdisciplinary assessments (OT/PT, SW, NP, Pharm), create discharge plans, complete community referrals and provide mental health support to our diverse population.
