



Hamilton Wentworth District School Board (HWDSB) Year 2 Practicum September 2024 – April 2025

Please provide a description of the practicum site and student activities:

A practicum at the HWDSB involves exposure to working with students who are struggling with their attendance and overall school functioning. The student will have the opportunity to work individually with clients. They will also have the opportunity to work with educational staff in planning for the needs of at-risk students.

The students will participate in a half day per week of Group supervision with the other social work field placement interns from multiple universities. Group supervision will provide capacity building with regards to specific school board skills and practice areas with a focus on CBT/DBT training. Group supervision will also be a time to share case information/challenges so that the group can guide and learn from one another.

Students will have their own caseload and will have opportunities for direct clinical practice with students and caregivers. Students will have opportunities to complete comprehensive assessments, learn CBT/DBT modalities, co-facilitate treatment groups and administer standardized testing.

Practicum Requirements:

- Vulnerable Sector Check
- Driver's license required
- Access to a car required

This practicum will mostly involve direct work.
