Victim Services Toronto (VST) provides trauma-informed support and advocacy in the moment for any person in Toronto who has experienced crime or sudden tragedy. We work to prevent violence through community engagement. Our vision is a thriving community where people are safe, supported and empowered.

Students will participate in practical training and direct practice activities working side by side crisis counselors in office to complete police and client intakes, conduct suicide risk assessments, client needs and safety assessments, and safety planning. Provide crisis intervention, emotional and practical support, information, and referrals/linkages to clients over the phone and face to face.

Students will have the opportunity to participate in indirect practice activities such as resource development, research, and various internal committees.
