Year 2 Practicum September 2024 – April 2025

Practicum Description

This practicum will be focused on learning about a range of women's reproductive health and mental health issues. The student will be co-supervised by social workers working in the Reproductive Life Stages Program, a specialized mental health program at Women's College Hospital. The program provides comprehensive assessment and treatment for women and their partners who are experiencing mood and anxiety difficulties related to reproductive life stage issues. Modalities include individual, mother-infant (dyadic), couples, and group therapy.

Student activities to develop social work competencies

<u>Direct Service Delivery/Interventions/Working with Recipients of Service:</u>

- Conduct intake/needs assessments
- Provide resource and referral information
- Develop, promote, plan and/or (co)facilitate educational groups or workshops
- Develop and implement individual, family, or group interventions assessment, implementation and evaluation of interventions
- Counsel (individuals, families, couples) in office or in community
- Deliver crisis intervention

Indirect Service Delivery:

- Evaluate social work interventions
- Prepare and maintain case notes, reports, statistics which meet the organization's accountability guidelines
- Contribute to research and other organizational initiatives
- Develop skills in cross-cultural/spiritual competence
- Develop, plan and implement prevention activities and programs

Practicum Requirements

- Immunizations per PHA Guidelines
- N95 Respirator/Mask Fitting
- Covid Vaccinations
- Influenza Vaccination (Flu shot)
- Comfort working with the population being served
- Comprehensive report writing and documentation
- Other requirements: Flexibility in regards to sometimes working from home, sometimes being onsite. However open to discussion if student requires a remote placement.
