Year 2 Practicum September 2024 – April 2025

Practicum Description

This placement takes place in the Outpatient Gynecology Clinic within the Women's Health Program at St. Michael's Hospital.

This placement provides a unique combination of social work directed systems navigation, discharge planning and drug coverage access, as well as the opportunity to provide short term psychotherapy/sex therapy and group psychotherapy to individuals referred to the Outpatient Gynecology Clinic. This placement also includes the Early Pregnancy Management Clinic, which provides medical follow up to patients who have recently had a miscarriage.

In addition, this placement will provide the opportunity for participation in the creation of webinars, etc. for the clinic/patient population and will include facilitation of mindfulness based groups individuals with chronic vulvar/gyne conditions. Students will complete biopsychosocial sexual assessments for patients and will have the opportunity to provide short term psychotherapy.

This placement requires some familiarity with systems navigation (eg. accessing the Shelter system, home care/LHIN, familiarity with drug coverage, federal vs provincial resources, etc).
