Boomerang Health is a multidisciplinary outpatient clinic serving paediatric clients under the age of 18. Boomerang Health provides both medical and rehabilitation services including but not limited to; psychotherapy, psychological assessment, physiotherapy, speech language pathology, occupational therapy and nutrition support. The Brain and Mental Health team is comprised of psychologists, social workers and psychotherapists who provide assessment and psychotherapeutic intervention services for a wide range of presenting concerns in children preschool aged and above.
